

Overwhelmed: by the Resurrection

Luke 24: 1-50

Remembering that the scriptures are always telling a story...do you find it interesting that the text makes it a point to mention that it was "early on Sunday morning"? Why do you think that is?

What jump out to you about the account of the women going to the tomb found in verses 1-10?

After Jesus rose from the dead, some of his closest friends didn't seem to recognize him right away. Why do you think that is? Doesn't that seem strange?

V. 30 says, "*As they sat down to eat, he took the bread and blessed it. Then he broke it and gave it to them. Suddenly their eyes were opened and they recognized him. And at the moment he disappeared!*" Why is it at this point that they were able to recognize him?

Read v. 38-40 again. How is this both challenging and gracious? If your honest with yourself and this group, is there one area of your life that you need Jesus to prove he is who he says he is?

Death and resurrection are central to the gospel message. Why so, why is this central to our understanding of what it means to be a follower of Jesus?

What did you need to be reminded of from this text? How can that have an impact on your faith story?
